Operation Units and Responsibilities

- International Affairs Division of National Police Agency
 In accordance with the regulations governing the operation of National Police
 Agency, Ministry of the Interior, the International Affairs Division is in charge of:
- (1) Planning and overseeing the investigation of illegal activities of foreigners, people from mainland China, residents of Hong Kong or Macau, and people without household registration in Taiwan
- (2) Planning and overseeing the prevention and investigation of foreign-related cases
- (3) Planning and overseeing the collection and analysis of foreign-related information
- (4) Planning and overseeing international police cooperation, interaction, and visits
- (5) Planning and overseeing cross-strait interaction related to police work
- (6) Planning and overseeing the issuance of Police Criminal Record Certificates
- (7) Assisting in planning and overseeing dignitary protection for foreign heads of state, important officials, VIP visitors and international conferences
- (8) Assisting in planning and overseeing security work of embassies, consulates, institutions, international organizations, officials, and official residences
- (9) Assisting in connecting, planning and overseeing crackdowns on illegal entry of foreigners, people from mainland China, residents of Hong Kong or Macau, and people without household registration in Taiwan
- (10) Other police work related to foreign affairs
- Foreign Affairs Sections of Municipality/County/City Police Departments
 Each foreign affairs section of a municipality/county/city police department or
 each administration section of Kinmen/Lienchiang County Police Bureau is
 responsible for carrying out various tasks planned by the International Affairs
 Division of National Police Agency.
- 3. Other Specialized Organizations

There have been international sections in some specialized organizations, such as the Aviation Police Bureau and the Harbor Police Departments (except Hualien). There are also foreign police officers in other specialized organizations, including the National Highway Police Bureau, the Railway Police Bureau, the Special Police Second, Third, and Seventh Corps, depending on the organizations' functions and regional characteristics.
